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### INTRODUCTION



Read this manual carefully before operating your FAST equipment. The information presented will prepare you to safely operate and service your

machine. Require all operators to read this manual carefully and be acquainted with all the operating and adjustment procedures before attempting to operate. Failure to follow the information in this manual and on decals may result in personal injury or equipment damage.

This manual should be considered a permanent part of this equipment and should remain with the equipment when you sell it. Replacement manuals can be obtained from your FAST dealer.

This equipment has been engineered and manufactured to provide dependable and satisfactory use. Like all mechanical products, it will require cleaning and upkeep. Inspect your equipment before putting it into service. Your authorized FAST dealer has trained mechanics, genuine FAST service parts, and the necessary tools and equipment when service is needed. Use only genuine FAST parts for service or repairs. Substitute parts will void the warranty and may not meet standards for safe and satisfactory operation.

Warranty is provided as part of FAST's support program for customers who operate and maintain their equipment as described in this manual. The warranty is explained on the warranty certificate you should have received from your dealer. This warranty provides you with the assurance that FAST will back its products where defects appear within the warranty period. Should the equipment be abused or modified to change its performance beyond the original factory specifications, the warranty will become void.

These instructions have been compiled from field experience and engineering data. Some information may be general in nature, due to unknown and varying operating conditions. However, through experience and these instructions, you should be able to develop procedures suitable to your particular situation.



### **GENERAL SAFTEY**




Carefully read and follow all safety messages in this manual and safety signs (decals) on equipment.

### **Prepare for Emergencies**

Wear close fitting clothing and safety equipment appropriate for the job.


Wear the appropriate protective clothing and devices as described on the chemical SDS sheet.

### **Handle Chemicals Safely**

Direct exposure to hazardous chemicals can cause serious injury.

A Safety Data Sheet (SDS) (formerly Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS)) provides specific details on chemical products: physical and health hazards, safety procedures, and emergency response techniques.

Read the chemical manufacturers warning, instructions and procedures before starting and follow them exactly.



Potentially hazardous chemicals are used with FAST equipment include such items as lubricants, coolants, paints, and adhesives.

Check the SDS before you start any job using a hazardous chemical. That way you will know exactly what the risks are and how to do the job safely. Then follow procedures and recommended equipment.



### **Keep Riders Off Machine**

Do not allow riders on the equipment or the tractor during operation or transport.

Riders are subject to injury from being struck by foreign objects, exposure to chemicals, and being thrown off the machine.



Riders obstruct the operator's view resulting in the machine being operated in an unsafe way.

Riders are subject to exposure to chemicals as they are being applied which could create a health hazard.

### **Maintenance Safety**

Understand service procedures before starting work. Keep service area clean and dry.

Never lubricate, service or adjust machine while it is moving. Keep hands, feet and clothing from powerdriven parts.

Lower equipment to the ground.

Relieve pressure before serving or disconnecting from the tractor.

Stop the engine. Remove the key. Allow the machine to cool.

Securely support all machine elements that must be raised for service work. Use tools, jacks, and hoists of sufficient capacity for the job.

Clear area of bystanders when making adjustments, servicing or repairing the equipment.

Use adequate lighting for the job.

Keep all parts in good condition and properly installed. Fix damaged components immediately. Replace worn and broken parts.

Remove any build-up of grease, oil, or debris.

Remove paint and any residue from solvents before welding or heating.

### **Waste Disposal Safety**

Improper disposal of waste can threaten the environment and ecology. Potentially harmful waste used with FAST equipment includes oil, coolant, brake fluid, filters, and batteries.

Use leak-proof containers when draining fluids. Do not use food or beverage containers that may mislead someone into drinking from them.

Do not allow riders on the equipment or tractor.

Make sure everyone is clear of the machine before filling equipment tank, starting tractor engine or beginning operation.

Read chemical or fertilizer manufacturers warnings, instructions, and procedures before starting and follow them exactly.

Do not breathe, touch or ingest chemicals or fertilizers. Always wear protective clothing and follow safe handling procedures.







# COULTER INSTALL COULTER MOUNTS



- 1. Measure the position of each Coulter Mount. Adjust position as needed.
- 2. Torque to 270 N-m (200 ft-lbs.)



Nut and washer arrangement for Coulter Mount.

### **INSTALL THE COULTER**

The octagon shaft set forward is the standard position, but the shaft can be rotated as needed to provide mounting clearance.


The coulter offset can be positioned in 45-degree increments by the Octagon Shaft in the Coulter Mount.

45 degrees = 89 mm (3.5") offset 90 degrees = 127 mm (5") offset

The range of swing motion can be set by positioning the Coulter Rotation Plate on the square shaft. The Coulter Rotation Plate can be flipped upside down for more range options. See "COULTER ADJUSTMENT".

Coulter rotated 45° with Coulter Rotation Plate positioned for no rotation.

# **COULTER INSTALL**





3. Lift the Coulter and insert the octagon shaft into the mount.



5. Adjust the Coulter height to allow both cross bolts to be installed in line with the grooves in the octagon shaft.



4. Raise the Coulters to the desired height.



6. Torque to 285 N-m (210 ft-lbs.). Increase torque until the Octagon Shaft does not wiggle in the Coulter Mount.

7. Repeat to install all Coulters.

NOTE: Refer to the equipment manual for the for plumbing instructions.



### **COULTER ADJUSTMENT**


# ADJUST COULTER SIDE-TO-SIDE MOVEMENT



1. Adjust the side-to-side movement of the Coulter by removing the pin.



2. Remove the washers.




- 3. Turn the Coulter and adjust the position of the Coulter Rotation Plate.
  - •The Coulter Rotation Plate can be flipped over for more range of motion options.
- 4. Set the Coulter Rotation Plate against the tab on the Octagon Shaft to adjust the range of side-to-side movement of the Coulter.

5. Reinstall the washer and pin.

### ADJUST COULTER DOWN PRESSURE

The Coulter down pressure is obtained by the pressure spring.


NOTE: Down pressure has been preset at the factory.



Adjust down pressure with the tension spring nut.

- •Tighten to increase pressure.
- •Loosen to decrease pressure.
- •Tension until spring measures 7.43 +/- 0.06" (18.87+/- 0.15 cm).

NOTE: For every 1/4" of extra spring compression coulter vertical travel is reduced by 1".






### INJECTOR NOZZLE ASSEMBLY

Organize all injector parts on table. Use liquid thread sealer on all threads.

IMPORTANT: There are two orifice tip sizes depending upon the machine configuration and application rate. The bag containing ONLY TWO ORIFICE TIPS ALWAYS GO TO THE OUTSIDE END COULTERS. The remaining tips go to all other coulters.




- A. 90° Elbow
- B. 5 in. Nipple
- C. Female Inlet
- D. Injector Orifice Tip, (Refer to IMPORTANT Above)
- E. Bracket
- F. Bolt 1/2 x 4 in, Jam Nut and Nylock Nut
- G. Check Value With Hose Barb
- H. Center Set Screw
- I Bottom Two Shank Holes
- K. Nut
- 6. Install injector assembly in bottom two shank holes (I).
- 7. Tighten Nylock nut and jam nut.

### ADJUST INJECTOR NOZZLE

For best performance the Injector Nozzle should be adjusted so that it puts the stream of liquid directly into the slot the Coulter Blade made.





- 1. Visually site the injector Nozzle position related to the Coulter. To adjust the Nozzle angle:
  - Loosen setscrew (H) to adjust the Nozzle angle and center the stream about 50 mm (2 in.) or as close as practical behind the Coulter Blade.
- 2. To adjust the Nozzle height:
  - Loosen setscrew (J) to adjust the Nozzle height. The Nozzle tip should not extend past the Rock Guard.
- 3. Turn on the system and test stream position.
- 4. Adjust as needed.






### **Install the Coulter Knife Assembly**

The optional Coulter Knife Assembly may be installed in place of the injector nozzle.

### Non-Adjustable Knife Installation (2022 and newer)

This non-adjustable knife assembly fits in place of adjustable knife assembly on AP Coulters 2022 and older.









### Adjustable Knife Assembly (2022 and older AP Coulters)

- 1. Insert the 3/8 x 2" bolt through the knife adjuster. Secure using a 3/8" jam nut on the outside and a 3/8" square nut on the inside. See "AP Coulter Knife Option Assembly" for part identification.
- 2. Install the knife mount (3) on to the coulter arm using  $\frac{1}{2}$ " bolts. Secure from bolt with  $\frac{1}{2}$ " lock washer and nut. Attach the knife adjuster (2) to the knife mount using a  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 2" bolt (11). Make sure the welded in washer is on the left side.






3. Add the  $\frac{1}{4}$ " shim (1) to the top knife mount bolt. Add additional shims (4,5,6) as needed to align the knife behind the coulter blade.






4. Install the knife (12) and loosely secure with  $\frac{1}{2}$ " lock washers and nuts. Use a  $\frac{1}{2}$ " flat washer on the lower knife slot.




### ADJUST THE KNIFE ASSEMBLY

- 1. Adjust the knife (12) so that there is a small gap between the blade and knife tip. Tighten the  $\frac{1}{2}$  nuts.
- 2. Adjust the 3/8" bolt on the knife adjuster so that it is tight against the knife mount. Tighten the 3/8" jam nut to secure.
- 3. After knife is properly adjusted with .26" (6.6mm) gap between knife tip and blade OD, spin blade to ensure the knife misses the blade, adjust as necessary.






### **DEFENDER®**



The optional Defender® is used to shield plants from airborne soil caused by Coulter rotation.

The Defender® is used with the injector nozzles.

### **Install the DEFENDER®**



See "DEFENDER® for Injection Assembly" for part identification.

- 1. Fit the Defender® (1) around the Injector Nozzle and Rock Guard.
- 2. Install the two bolts (2) with the bolt heads toward the Injector nozzle.
- 3. Install the Toplock nuts.
- 4. Adjust height by using the upper or lower mounting holes.



### **MAINTENANCE**



1. Grease Coulter hubs through the provided zerks every 100 hours of use, before and after storage.



- 2. Inspect Coulters for damage before use and frequently when working in rocky conditions.
- 3. Replace bent, chipped or broken coulter blades.
  - •Remove the 4 nuts and hub guard.
  - •Remove the damaged coulter blades.
  - •Install the new coulter blade.
  - •Reinstall the hub guard and all 4 nuts.
  - •Torque to 61 N-m (45 ft-lbs.)
